- Only research studies will be accepted. The submitted abstracts will be scrutinized by the scientific committee and the acceptance/rejection of the abstracts will be intimated through e-mail.
- Researcher should certify that it is his/her own research work and has not yet been published or presented at any conference/scientific meeting.
- The time allocated for oral presentation is 3 minutes.
- For poster presentation, the material is only accepted and should adhere to the same rules of abstract presentation.
- Poster size for presentation - (Short) 30x 120 cms.
- Best oral and poster presentation will be awarded.

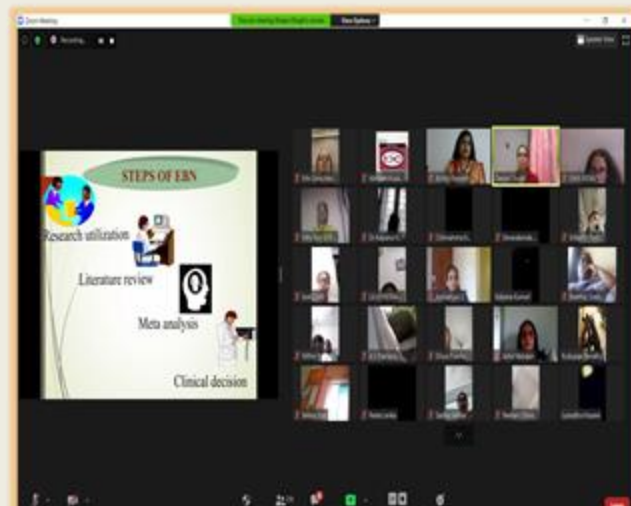
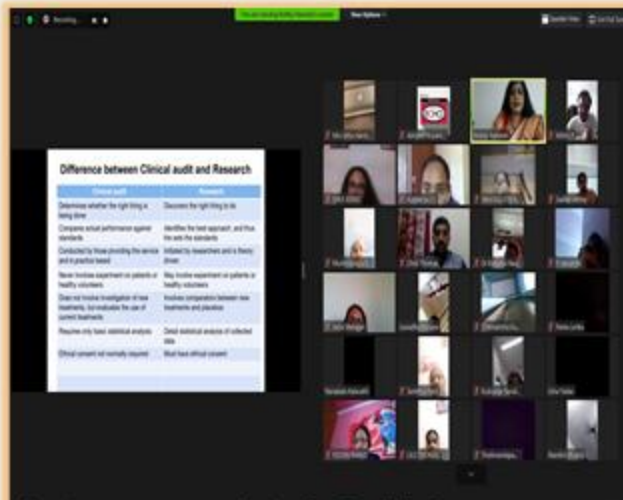
